## CIVIL AIR PATROL

- To serve America by developing our Nation's youth;

# Memorandum of Understanding Maryland National Guard & Maryland Wing

20 December 2001

- ...Use best efforts to support one another, consistent with...laws and regulations...in accomplishing...(their) missions.
- ...Designate liaison officers to coordinate all matters of mutual concern and assistance.
- ...Use best efforts to augment Maryland National Guard resources when requested.

# Memorandum of Understanding

(Continued)

- Work close cooperation with Maryland National Guard in the implementation of CAP missions in which two organizations have a role...Counterdrug and Disaster Relief Missions.
- Will make available to Maryland Wing CAP...assets and resources...facilities and real estate within constraints of mission readiness...budget limitations...law and regulation affecting their use....




