

## Eligibility & Application Requirements

Scholarships are generally advertised each fall for the academic year that begins the following fall.

Deadlines vary depending on the scholarship program. All scholarships are available only to current CAP cadet officers and senior members.

## Scholarship Programs

**Auburn University, Department of Fiber Engineering** Satellite flywheels, rocket motor nozzles, airfoils, and bullet-proofing are only some of the high-tech projects related to fiber engineering. Auburn University annually sets aside one scholarship for a CAP cadet to study fiber engineering, textile chemistry, or textile management at Auburn.

**CAP Corporate Scholarships** CAP provides college scholarships for undergraduates and graduates. Scholarship amounts vary. Some of the top-ranking cadets receive special scholarships sponsored by the Air Force Association, USAA, and Who's Who Among American High School Students.

**Dowling College School of Aviation** CAP members have several aeronautical majors to choose from at Dowling College. Dowling offers a 1-year and a 2-year scholarship to CAP members annually.

**Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University** Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University makes three \$1,000 scholarships available to CAP members who enroll at their university and complete the first semester of AFROTC.

**The Order of Daedalians** Aspiring military aviators have an opportunity to earn their pilot's license through this scholarship, sponsored by the Daedalians. Graduates of CAP flight academies are especially encouraged to apply.

**The Spaatz Association** The Spaatz Association provides an annual scholarship to help a cadet who has flown solo advance to earn a pilot's license and/or attend a leadership-related CAP activity.

**Spartan School of Aeronautics** Offering programs in avionics, mechanics, flight training, aviation technology, and more, the Spartan School of Aeronautics makes 26 scholarships available to CAP members every year.

**Texas A&M University Corps of Cadets** With the largest uniformed student body in the nation, Texas A&M is a school where CAP cadets may continue their study of leadership while attending a major university. Scholarship recipients automatically qualify for in-state tuition.

**USAF Academy Preparatory School** Each year the USAF Academy reserves at least one slot at the Academy's Preparatory School for a CAP cadet. Cadets admitted to the Preparatory School are highly-likely to enter the Academy the following year. Cadets who dream of entering the Academy should definitely apply for this program.
